Oral Cares

- ✓ Provide patients with oral care at a minimum of once per shift.
- ✓ If you work in an intensive care unit and your patient is intubated, oral care is provided every 2-4 hours and as needed.
- ✓ If you are taking care of an Oncology patient (cancer), please get direction from your Nurse as to the patient's needs

Intubated or unconscious patients		
Gather equipment	Patient Care Tech Action:	
• PPE		
	1. Hand hygiene.	
• Suction	2. Apply PPE.	
	3. Have suction available.	
Suction toothbrush	4. Position patient's head to side or elevate HOB 45.	
Alcohol free	5. Brush teeth 1-2 minutes using suction toothbrush and small amts of water or oral rinse. Brush surface of tongue.	
antiseptic oral rinse	6. Be cautious if patient is on blood thinners. Utilize suction and may require several swabs to collect debris and mucous.	
Mouth moisturizer	7. Apply mouth moisturizer and lip balm. Be careful as not to disturb ET tube.	
Lip balm if needed		

Conscious and non-intubated patients		
Gather Equipment	Patient Care Tech Action:	
 Toothbrush 		
	1. If patient is independent, allow for independence.	
Toothpaste	2. Prepare equipment at bedside. Perform hand hygiene. Utilize mask if splashing occurs.	
• Cool Water	3. Apply toothpaste to brush, holding over emesis basin. Have patient brush teeth. Instruct to hold bristles on inner and outer	
• Emesis basin	portions of teeth and gum line. Encourage to brush tongue.	
• Bath towel	4. Have patient rinse mouth thoroughly. Not to swallow water if patient is NPO (nothing per oral cavity). Patients who are NPO	
• PPE	will require frequent oral care due to dryness. This procedure may also be accomplished at the patients sink, if patient is ambulatory.	



<u>Dentures</u>		
Gather equipment	Patient care Tech action:	
 Toothbrush 	1. Fill emesis basin with water.	
Denture brush	2. Hand hygiene3. PPE	
Emesis basin	4. Remove denturesupper plate with thumb and index finger wrapped in gauze and pull downward. Lower denturelift from jaw and rotate	
Denture cleanser	one side downward to remove. 5. Place dentures in emesis basin.	
Water glass	6. Apply denture cleanser to denture bush, moisten with water and brush all surfaces of dentures	
 Denture cup 	7. Rinse with tepid water.	
Washcloth	8. Brush patient's gums, tongue and palate with soft toothbrush9. Have patient rinse oral cavity with water.	
• 4 x4 gauze	10. Return dentures in tepid water labeled denture cup.11. Document frequency of oral care provided	
• PPE	12. Document the condition of the oral cavity once per shift	

Oral care for chemotherapy patients

- ✓ If you are taking care of an Oncology patient (one who has cancer) and if they are undergoing chemotherapy. Oral care is paramount.
- ✓ Please discuss with your RN how frequent oral care should be given to your patient.
- ✓ Also discuss what type of oral care needs are to be given (depending on lab work, ie platelet count)
